

"KING IRON" Exhibit Opening/Historian Discussion

Tuesday, March 12, 2024

Join us March 12 as we gather to celebrate the opening of our newest temporary exhibition, "KING IRON: THE UNTOLD STORY OF ENSLAVED FURNACE WORKERS IN TENNESSEE." Funded by Tennessee Humanities and created by the Tennessee African-American Historical Group, this new traveling exhibit examines the little-known story of enslaved iron workers in the Volunteer State. Well researched and curated, "King Iron" seeks to further our understanding of pre-Civil War Tennessee through the lens of industrial slavery and its regional impact.

The exhibition opening will be accompanied by a panel discussion with the Tennessee African-American Historical Group and descendants of enslaved iron workers from within Middle Tennessee.

This event is FREE and open to the public. Refreshments will be served at 6 p.m.
