and Nashville Post — an internet news source he co-founded. Then he wrote a Nashville history book called Fortunes, Fiddles and Fried Chicken: A Nashville Business History. In 2004, Carey started the non-profit organization known as Tennessee History for Kids, which helps public school teachers cover Tennessee History, U.S. history and basic social studies. He has made a living as the executive director of Tennessee History for Kids since that time, and as part of that job writes the monthly history column for Tennessee Magazine.
