

# "River Life" Specialty Plate Pre-Orders Needed

A committee has been established under the Bedford County Partnership to raise funds for a "River Life" specialty license plate. Pre-orders are necessary prior to the actual plate being approved as a part of the license plate offerings by the State of



Tennessee. This idea was sparked due to strong growth in kayaking on the Duck River in recent years.

The growth has led to an increased number of rescue incidents, many of them from out-of-county residents who own their own kayaks. The area rental companies stay very aware of river conditions and are generally not going to rent kayaks when conditions are dangerous and safety could be compromised. During the last five years, there have been 42 search and rescue events on the Duck River just in Bedford County.

Discussion in the committee meetings on this issue prompted the proposal for a "River Life" specialty plate which would raise funds for safety, rescue, and education about the Duck River. The plate was designed by Alejandro Contreras Cabrera, a Shelbyville Central High School student who won the contest to design the plate. Kudos to Alejandro for such a vibrant and artistic design.

However, keep in mind the plate is designed to focus on all Tennessee rivers -not just the Duck River – safety is paramount on all of Tennessee's lakes, rivers and streams and this specialty plate serves as a good visual reminder on your car when on the road.

Pre-orders are required for the specialty plate to go into production. It is the committee's hope that given the required number of pre-orders, the plate offering is expected to be sometime during mid-2023.

The Duck River flows 284 miles from east to west across Middle Tennessee making it the longest river located entirely in the state. It is deemed the most biologically diverse river in North America with over 50 species of freshwater mussels and 151 fish species. High productivity lends itself to exceptional fisheries and a desire to kayak the river and enjoy its scenic beauty.


