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Welcome to Tennessee's Backroads

Tennessee's Backroads Heritage began as a non-profit organization in the early 1990s as a pilot project under the National Trust for Historic Preservation. This seven-county area in Southern Middle Tennessee will offer you some of the best attractions, festivals, and outdoor recreation in the State of Tennessee. Geographically, the Backroads communities cover towns just a short distance south of Nashville or west of Chattanooga. This part of Tennessee allows travelers to truly enjoy traveling at a slower pace and not be in such a hurry.

You are encouraged to explore this travel guide where you will discover historical and cultural sites, scenic areas, hiking and outdoor recreation, aviation history, artisans, lodging and camping, and great downhome restaurants. Agricultural sites showcase farmers markets, equine sites and festivals that will entice you to travel the backroads for an up close and personal experience. Special focus is given to "buy and support local" businesses.

This area is proud to have some of the most well-known festivals in the country such as the Bonnaroo Music and Arts Festival, the largest music festival in the United States, an 11-day horse show in Shelbyville known as "The Celebration", the Jack Daniel's Invitational BBQ Cookoff in famous Lynchburg, and the Lions Club "Super Pull of the South" just to name a few. And, there are also unusual festivals like the culinary festival showcasing the famous "Slawburger" that is widely served in the Fayetteville area. There is always a festival in one of the communities, a music concert or live music or a special event.

For the train history enthusiasts, many communities enjoy the sound of "train whistles" that trail throughout the small towns such as Bell Buckle, Wartrace, Cowan and Tullahoma. Civil War history weaves its stories throughout the communities with a self-driving tour featuring kiosks that chronicle the 1863 Civil War struggle for Middle Tennessee known as "The Tullahoma Campaign."





The historic Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration Grounds in Shelbyville, TN is home to The Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration, which takes place each year in late summer for the 11 days ending on the Saturday night before Labor Day. It is a thrill to watch the more than 2,000 horses compete during the 11-day-and-night Celebration with the World Grand Champion emerging on the last Saturday night before Labor Day. The show has grown into its own 100-plus-acre equestrian complex; a complex frequented by many breeds and includes a 30,000-seat outdoor stadium, a 4,500-seat indoor arena, a covered outdoor practice arena, permanent stalls for more than 1,700 horses, and campgrounds featuring full hook-ups for more than 270 recreational vehicles.

In 1935, seven local horse trainers and breeders gathered to create the first walking horse association. The first year 208 horses were registered. This trail weaves through Southern Middle TN featuring the burial place of "Strolling Jim" - the first World Grand Champion of The Celebration (buried on the grounds of the former Walking Horse Hotel - Wartrace), The Celebration Grounds (Shelbyville), the Walking Horse Breeders and Exhibitors Association (Lewisburg), and various walking horse farms. Trail events are held throughout the year.





A Civil War tourist attraction, this hilltop pioneer cemetery was the silent witness to the Battle of Hoover's Gap in 1863. The cemetery is known as the Confederate Cemetery Park, one of the South's oldest Confederate cemeteries for fallen soldiers. This Civil War site has 56 Confederate soldiers buried at Beechgrove Confederate Cemetery Park. Open 7 days a week during daylight hours; audio and visual interpretation available on site. Markers for the Tullahoma Campaign Trail and picnic shelters available. Water and bathrooms available spring through fall.



The SCV is the oldest hereditary organization for male descendants of Confederate soldiers, organized in 1896. The SCV serves as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to insuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved. Elm Springs is a lovely antebellum home built in 1837 by two wealthy cotton merchants from New Orleans. In

1992, it was acquired by the SCV to serve as the national headquarters. "Elm Springs" is open Mon.-Fri., 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. CST. The home and gift shop are closed on Sat. and Sun. The gift shop offers a wide selection of books on the Civil War. "Elm Springs" can be reserved for special events, weddings and group tours with advanced notice.

The mission of this museum is to provide the public with a Southern perspective of the War Between the States and to educate all generations on the history of the War and its ongoing legacy.

The museum building was designed to resemble a large carriage house, one that might accent the style and age of historic Elm Springs. The interior of the museum features a spacious gift shop and lobby, a research library, and two exhibit halls, having 18,500 square feet of usable space with unfinished shell space that can be used for future growth.

When descending along the Machine Falls trail, you can observe exposed black Chattanooga shale at mid-slope, a formation that delineates these two Basins. Thickets of mountain laurel grow on

the upper slopes under a dry oak hickory forest canopy that is characteristic of Highland Rim vegetation. Short Springs is one of the very best Spring wildflower locations in the state showcasing Virginia bluebells, jack-in-the-pulpit, larkspur, and Dutchman's breeches.

The Forest is on the Cumberland Plateau and located in south-central Tennessee, in Marion and Franklin Counties. The forest is 35-40 miles west of Chattanooga. About 99% of the land is forested and about 90% of the land is in hardwood forest types both young and mature. About 10% of the Forest is pine. The area has a history of timber abuse by diameter-limit cuts and uncontrolled wildfires. It is home to a diverse number of wildlife species. The forest has been traditionally used for hunting, hiking, horseback riding, mountain biking and camping.





